Best of Variety

Best of Variety Competition: The following dogs are eligible for entry in the Best of Variety Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record; Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owners' records.

Non-Regular Classes, Involving Single Dog Entries

Veteran ó Open to Dogs and Bitches 7 years of age or older. In accordance with AKC rules, neutered dogs and spayed bitches are eligible to compete in Veteran classes at independent specialties.

Field Trial Class ó Open to Dogs and Bitches that have placed in an American Kennel Club Member or Licensed Field Trial.

Dual Champion Class - Open to Dogs and Bitches that have earned both an AKC Conformation Championship as well as an AKC Field Trial Championship.

Winners from Veteran, Dual Champion and Field Trial Classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Variety if otherwise undefeated on the day of the show.

Non-Regular Classes, Involving Multiple Dog Entries

Stud Dog Class (DCA Only) ó will be for Stud Dogs and at least two and no more than three of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with its Get. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of Get. Get are only to be judged based upon their merits. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under Dog Show Rules, AKC Policy or the breed standard. Get must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Variety Competition or some other Non-Regular Class. In accordance with AKC rule Ch. 11, Sec 8, a neutered dog may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class.

Brood Bitch Class (DCA Only) - will be for Brood Bitches and at least two and no more than three of their Produce. Brood Bitches must be entered in the Brood Bitch Class and must be shown in the ring

with its Produce. The owner of the Brood Bitch need not necessarily be the owner of Produce. Produce are only to be judged based upon their merits. While the merits of the Brood Bitch are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Brood Bitch must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under Dog Show Rules, AKC Policy or the breed standard. Produce must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Variety Competition or some other Non-Regular Class. In accordance with AKC rule Ch. 11, Sec 8, a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class.

Brace Class (DCA Only) – will be for two dogs of the same Variety with at least one common owner. Dogs do not have to be entered in another class at this show. The entry forms must be marked accordingly in the space for Classes as a Brace.

Parade of Veterans (DCSAV on Wednesday 9-29-10 and DCA on Friday 10-1-10) - These non-competitive Parades are open to any Dachshund that is 7 years of age or older and not entered in any other class at the show. **Please email a short history (150 words or less) of your Veteran no later than September 8, 2010 to Cheryl Shultz at cherevee@sbcglobal.net (preferred) or attach a hard copy to the DCA 2010 Order Form in this premium list.**

Pet caretakers will be responsible for the clean up and disposal of all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted in the restaurant and must be on a leash at all times inside the hotel.

In an effort to promote the entire dachshund and showcase the versatility of our breed, DCA is awarding Triathlon awards to the dachshunds which distinguish themselves in performance and/or companion events at the National Specialty. Any dachshund qualifying in three or more different performance and/or companion event categories plus the Triathlon Conformation Evaluation will be recognized by the DCA with a Certificate of Achievement. The highest combined scoring dog will receive the title of DCA Triathlon Dog of the Year.

SCORING OF THE EVENTS

Dogs may use the points earned from one class or test per category. Obedience and Rally are combined to form a single category for Triathlon purposes.

The Triathlon Committee will select three judges to complete the Conformation Evaluation. The total judges' scores will be divided by the number of judges and rounded to the nearest whole number. Two or more judges rating the dog "Fail" will disqualify the dog from the Triathlon competition. AKC conformation Champions of record will automatically be granted 3 points and be excluded from the conformation evaluation process.

ADDITIONAL RULES AND ADMINISTRATION

- *Neutered/spayed dachshunds are eligible to compete.
- *ILP dogs are eligible to compete and can earn a Certificate of Achievement, but are not eligible for Triathlon Dog of the Year.
- *Entry in three or more DCA National performance and/or companion categories shall constitute an entry in the Triathlon. There is no entry fee.
- *Any dachshund not able to participate in the Conformation Evaluation portion of the Triathlon shall be considered ineligible for competition.
- *Only those scores earned in the DCA National performance and/or companion events shall count. Host shows and Regional events held in conjunction with the DCA National shall not be considered a part of the Triathlon event.
- *The DCA Board shall appoint a Triathlon Chairman who shall select a Committee to administer the program. The Committee shall be charged with the responsibility of developing a tracking system, prepare advertising, necessary forms and the general coordination of the program.

ADDITIONAL RULES

1. Entries must reach the Superintendent, Jack Bradshaw, 5434 East Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles CA, 90022, by Noon, Wednesday, September 8, 2010 PDT. Fees should accompany entries. This club and/or its superintendent assume no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or agent of the owner. This club and its superintendents assume no responsibility for the owner or owner's agents entering a dog in a class in which the dog is not eligible to compete, or for entering the same dog twice.
2. Returned Checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Superintendent will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check and declined credit card. Subsequent returned checks for the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis. The returned check or declined credit card must be made good by cash or money order BEFORE the dog will be allowed in the ring.
3. Exhibitors' identification tickets and judging programs will be mailed to the address given on the entry blank. If not received within a reasonable time prior to the show, notify the Superintendent. Tickets returned by the Post Office marked 'undeliverable' will be held at the Superintendent's Office. Please bring your identification tickets to the show.
4. During the hours of judging, owners are to be on call and have their dogs ready to bring into the judging ring promptly in order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for their judging. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class. Owners of dogs or the handlers of the dogs alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. This means it is not the responsibility of the ring steward, nor of any agent of the show-giving club to locate any dog, its owner or handler, when the dog's presence is needed in a judging ring. It should be understood by every exhibitor and handler that waiting for dogs to be brought into the ring is a courtesy extended to the owner or handler of the dog. There is no rule of this club nor of The American Kennel Club that requires a judge to wait for an owner or handler to bring his dog into the ring. Show hours 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
5. Trophies and prizes will be awarded in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed and the Superintendent's office advised at once, in the event of any discrepancy. All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed.
6. Exhibitors are admonished to make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this premium list. Rule books are available at the Superintendent's table at the shows or may be obtained from the A.K.C., P.O. Box 900051, Raleigh, NC 27675-9051.
7. The club, its superintendents or their employees will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other causes and in addition assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by an exhibitor or handler. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.
8. No grooming tables, pens or exhibitors setups will be allowed in the aisles and all grooming must be done away from the judging ring in areas specified by the club.
9. Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by veterinarian or judge, barred from competition by action of the Bench Show Committee, or because the dog is ineligible to compete due to being entered incorrectly. There is no refund of entry fee for duplicate entry. There will be a \$2.00 fee charged for cancellation of entry prior to closing of entries.
10. There is no provision offered for unentered dogs at this show.
11. Declination of Entries. The Dachshund Club of Santa Ana Valley and/or the Dachshund Club of America may decline any entries for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or any official thereof.
12. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the show giving club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
13. Do not leave any dogs in closed vehicles.
14. A Recording Fee of 50 cents per dog, an Event Services Fee of \$3.00 per entry, and a \$3.00 rally fee will be required at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience Trial or Tracking Test. An AKC Rally Recording Fee will be required for each dog entered at any Licensed or Member Club Rally Trial. These fees are to be collected by the Show-giving Club and paid to the American Kennel Club. American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2.)
15. Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed or Variety Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation judging at the Show.
16. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of the earliest conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.
17. Dogs which according to their owners' records have earned an obedience or rally title after the closing of entries for the show may be moved up to the next class, provided this transfer is made in writing and presented to the superintendent at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial.
18. Practicing is not allowed in rings at any time.
19. Parents and/or Guardians are responsible for the actions of their children.
